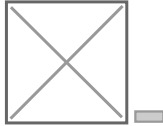

Day Wise Itinerary:

Day 01: NJP Rly Station / IXB Airport → Phuentsholing (Distance: 170 kms. / Driving Time: 5 hrs. / Altitude of Phuentsholing: 293 mts.)

On Day 01, you will arrive at Bagdogra Airport, where your personal chauffeur will be waiting to escort you to the enchanting town of Phuentsholing, located 170 kilometers away, a journey that will take approximately five hours. As you ascend to an altitude of 293 meters, you will have the opportunity to unwind upon your arrival. The evening is yours to enjoy at your leisure; feel free to explore the vibrant local market, where you can discover exquisite souvenirs and handcrafted gifts from Bhutan. The remainder of the day is yours to savor, culminating in a restful overnight stay in the serene surroundings of Phuentsholing.

Day 02: Phuentsholing to Thimphu (Distance: 150 kms. / Driving Time: 5 hrs. / Altitude of Thimphu: 2350 mts.)

On Day 02, embark on a scenic journey from Phuentsholing to Thimphu, covering a distance of 150 kilometers in approximately five hours, as you ascend to the majestic altitude of 2,350 meters in Thimphu. Following a delightful breakfast at your luxurious hotel, your knowledgeable Tour Guide will greet you and escort you to the immigration office in Phuentsholing to facilitate your immigration process. Along the way, indulge in breathtaking views at two exquisite viewpoints: the serene Dam viewpoint and the picturesque Dantak viewpoint, before visiting the revered Milarepa Lhakhang. Upon arrival, check in to your elegant hotel, where you will enjoy a restful overnight stay in the heart of Thimphu.

Day 03: Thimphu to Dochula Pass to Punakha/Wangdue Sightseeing (Distance: 77 kms. / Driving Time: 3 hrs. / Altitude of Thimphu Stay)

On Day 03, embark on a journey from Thimphu to the breathtaking Dochula Pass, followed by an exploration of Punakha and Wangdue. After a delightful breakfast, set off towards Dochula Pass, perched at an impressive altitude of 3100 meters, where the majestic Eastern Himalayas unfold before your eyes. This enchanting location is adorned with 108 stupas, and during the winter months, it transforms into a winter wonderland, blanketed in pristine snow.

Following this, immerse yourself in the rich history of Punakha Dzong, a magnificent fortress constructed in 1637 by the revered Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyal. For many years, it served as the administrative heart of the region until the reign of the second king, earning the name Druk Pungthang Dechen Phodrang, or the Palace of Great Happiness. As the day winds down, enjoy a leisurely evening before retreating to your accommodations in Thimphu for a restful night.

Day 04: Thimphu Half day Sightseeing to Paro Transfer (Distance: 65 kms. / Driving Time: 2 hrs. / Altitude of Paro: 2280 mts.)

On Day 04, embark on a captivating half-day sightseeing tour in Thimphu before transferring to the enchanting Paro, located 65 kilometers away, a journey that takes approximately two hours and ascends to an altitude of 2,280 meters. Begin your day with a delightful breakfast, followed by visits to remarkable sites such as the National Folk Heritage Museum, also known as Phelchey Toenkhyim, which showcases a traditional 19th-century Bhutanese house crafted from rammed mud and timber. Next, animal enthusiasts will find joy at the Motithang Takin Preserve, a beautifully maintained sanctuary originally designed as a small zoo, now home to the national animal of Bhutan, the Takin.

Ascend to the Buddha Dordenma Statue, a magnificent golden figure perched atop a hill, which houses 125,000 smaller Buddha statues, surpassing the local population of 100,000. Additionally, explore the Institute for Zorig Chusum, where aspiring artists hone their skills in traditional drawing, painting, and carving. As you make your way to Paro, stop at the historic Tamchog Lhakhang, built in the 13th century by the legendary Iron Bridge Builder, Thangthong Gyalpo, and cross an ancient bridge to reach this serene temple. Don't miss the Bhutan Postal Museum in the heart of Thimphu, where visitors can create their own Bhutanese stamp. Finally, upon arrival in Paro, check into your luxurious hotel for an overnight stay, immersing yourself in the rich culture and history of this remarkable region.

Day 05 : Paro Local Sightseeing

On the fifth day, indulge in the exquisite local sights of Paro after a delightful breakfast. Begin your journey at the Ta Dzong National Museum of Bhutan, a historic watchtower that now houses a remarkable collection of ancient Bhutanese artifacts and artworks, showcasing traditional costumes, weaponry, and daily life implements that reflect the nation's rich cultural heritage. Next, visit Rinpung Dzong, also known as Paro Dzong, a masterpiece of architecture built in 1644 by Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgya.

This stunning structure exemplifies traditional Bhutanese design and stands as a premier attraction in Paro. Continue your exploration at Kyichu Lhakhang, one of the oldest monasteries in Bhutan, established in the 7th century by the Tibetan King Songtsen Gampo. According to legend, he constructed 108 temples to subdue a giant demoness obstructing the spread of Buddhism, with this temple built on her left knee. Notably, the two orange trees within the monastery are said to bear fruit year-round, adding to its charm. Conclude your day with a visit to the Paro Airport, renowned for its breathtaking views and recognized as the country's first and only international airport, making it a must-see destination. Enjoy a luxurious overnight stay at your hotel in Paro!

Day 06: Paro to Phuentsholing- Gorumara(270 Kms/ 6 Hrs)

On the sixth day, after a delightful breakfast, guests will check out from their hotel and embark on a scenic journey to Gorumara, passing through the charming town of Phuentsholing. Upon arrival, they will be welcomed to their hotel for a luxurious overnight stay in the serene surroundings of Gorumara.

Day 07 :Gorumara to NJP Rly Station / IXB Airport

On the seventh day, embark on a captivating journey to Gorumara, where the enchanting Gorumara National Park awaits your exploration. Nestled in the serene Terai region of the Himalayan foothills in Northern West Bengal, this medium-sized sanctuary boasts lush grasslands and verdant forests, renowned for its thriving population of Indian Rhinoceros. Package Cost Excludes:

- Airfare and train fare are not included in the package.

- The costs for elephant and jeep safaris in Lataguri are not included.
- Charges for forest entrance fees and guide services are not part of the package.
- Any expenses incurred due to natural disasters, such as landslides, road blockages, or political disturbances (strikes), must be paid by the client on-site.
- Increases in taxes or fuel prices that affect surface transportation and land arrangements prior to departure will be the responsibility of the client.
- Charges for room heaters are not included.
- Any items not explicitly mentioned in the inclusions are excluded.
- The rates are applicable only to Indian nationals.

Child Policy:

- Children aged 12 years and older will incur charges equivalent to the Adult Rate.
- For children between the ages of 5 and 11 who share a room with their parents, charges will apply based on the Child With Bed (CWB) or Child No Bed (CNB) rates.
- Children under the age of 5 will be accommodated free of charge.
- The policy applies uniformly to all guests regardless of the booking method.
- It is essential to inform the hotel of the number of children at the time of booking.
- Additional charges may apply for extra bedding or amenities requested for children.
- The hotel reserves the right to verify the age of children at check-in.
- Parents are encouraged to review the policy to avoid any misunderstandings regarding charges.
- This policy is designed to ensure a comfortable stay for families.
- For any inquiries regarding the child policy, please contact the hotel directly.

Payment Policy:

- A reservation will be secured only upon receipt of a 50% deposit of the total package cost.
- All tour payments must be completed at least 2 days before departure.
- Final documentation will be provided only after the remaining balance has been settled.

Entry Formalities For Indian Tourist:

- Indian citizens are exempt from needing a visa to enter Bhutan.
- However, they must secure a travel permit prior to their journey.
- A Sustainable Development Fee (SDF) of INR 1200 per individual per night is required for entry into Bhutan.
- Children aged 6 to 12 years are eligible for a 50% discount on the SDF.
- Children aged 5 years and under are exempt from the SDF entirely.
- To obtain the entry permit for Bhutan, certain documents must be presented.
- A valid Indian passport, with at least 6 months of validity from the departure date, is necessary for individuals aged 18 and older.
- For children under 5 years, an original birth certificate in English is mandatory.
- For children aged 6 to 17 years, a school identity card along with the birth certificate is required.
- Additional requirements include passport-sized photographs, travel insurance with the insurer's seal, and a Covid-19 vaccination certificate, which can be substituted by the parents' certificate if traveling with them.

Important Notes:

- Photography requires prior permission before capturing images of individuals, events, or objects.
- Photography is strictly prohibited within the confines of temples, dzongs, or monasteries.
- Images may only be taken in the courtyard area of these religious sites.
- Touching religious artifacts or antiques is not allowed under any circumstances.
- The purchase of religious items, particularly antiques, is forbidden.
- It is essential to show respect by not climbing on or disrespecting Buddhist artifacts, regardless of their condition.
- Hats must be removed upon entering dzongs, temples, or monasteries.



- Entry into dzongs, temples, or monasteries is not permitted while wearing shorts, half pants, or slippers.
- Full-sleeved shirts or collared T-shirts are required for entry into certain dzongs and monasteries.
- Mobile phones must be turned off or set to silent mode before entering religious premises, and conversations should be kept to a whisper.
- Visitors should always walk in a clockwise direction when at religious sites.
- Pointing with a single finger is discouraged; instead, use an upturned flat hand to indicate sacred objects or places.
- Rubbish should only be disposed of in designated areas to maintain cleanliness.
- Touching ritual objects or mural paintings is prohibited to preserve their sanctity.
- Visitors should avoid stepping on any clothing, books, or materials left in religious areas.
- Smoking or consuming alcohol is not allowed in religious locations.
- If uncertain about any customs, it is advisable to consult local individuals or guides for guidance.
- Maintain a safe distance from lakes or rivers to prevent accidents.
- The use of tobacco products, including cigarettes, is banned throughout the kingdom.
- For personal use, travelers may bring in 200 imported cigarettes (10 packets) subject to a 200 percent duty, and Indian tobacco products are subject to a 100 percent duty.
- Indian nationals are permitted to carry currency notes up to Rs 100 while in Bhutan.
- Currency notes of Rs 500 and higher are prohibited by law in Bhutan.
- Only a limited number of ATM machines are accessible in Thimphu and Paro; it is advisable to consult your service provider for further information.
